Overview:

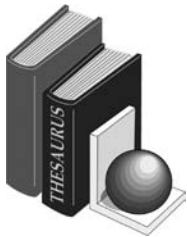
Learning vocabulary is an essential step in understanding a concept. This lesson will review vocabulary associated with Unit 1: “Hawai‘i Legends.”

Objectives:

The student will be able to match the following terms to their definitions: mo‘olelo, theory, experiment, hypothesis, caldera, kūpuna, scientific method, ‘ohe kāpala and Pele.

Materials:

Activity Procedure:
